Men's Shelter of Charlotte Policy on Accepting Inmates Released from Jail or Prison

The Men's Shelter of Charlotte, Inc. operates two emergency shelters for homeless men – campuses at 1210 N. Tryon Street and 3410 Statesville Avenue in Charlotte, N.C.

MSC is truly an emergency shelter homeless services provider; MSC does not serve as a half-way house, nor as a transitional housing agency. MSC is not a mental health or substance abuse recovery facility.

MSC will provide short-term emergency shelter for men being released from jail or prison **provided they meet MSC's criteria:**

- 1. The man must have been a citizen of Mecklenburg County at the time of his incarceration;**
- 2. The man must be homeless; and**
- 3. The man's needs (i.e. medical, mental health, substance abuse, behavior) must not be greater than our emergency shelter can accommodate. MSC will make this determination.**

The Men's Shelter does not shelter men who have any other housing options.

MSC strongly requires correctional institutes to contact our Client Services Director, Ashley Milano-Barnett at 704.834.3187 x 104 before releasing anyone with the intention of referring and/or transporting them to either Men's Shelter of Charlotte campus.

The Men's Shelter reserves the right to deny entrance to anyone who does not meet our definition of homeless and/or does not meet our criteria described above.
